## Biographies

### Daryl G. Hubbard

Brother Hubbard, the son of Dr. William E. and Winifred Hubbard, was initiated into Oklahoma Mu in 1956. A Stillwater native, he graduated from Oklahoma State University in 1958 with a BS in Chemistry, as well as a Commission in the United States Air Force.

On entering the Air Force he went directly into pilot training, at Spence AFB, GA; Webb AFB, TX; Williams AFB, AZ; and Nellis AFB, NV. He joined an operational squadron at Itazuke AB, Japan in 1960 in the F-100 aircraft. In 1962 he transferred to England AFB, LA, from which he made 2 tours to Danang AB, RVN. Later he transferred to Misawa AB, Japan, and then to Phan Rang AB, RVN for a year. In March 1967 he separated from the USAF at Travis AFB, CA. During his 9 years of active duty, Hubbard flew 306 combat missions in support of US Forces while in Vietnam. Unofficially, the most missions flown in Vietnam in the F-100.

Awards and decorations include: the Distinguished Flying Cross, 14 Air Medals, Combat Readiness Medal, Commendation Medal, Outstanding Unit Award, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with 2 stars, Vietnam Advisory Campaign with 1 star, Vietnam Defense with 1 star, Vietnam Campaign with attachment.

Hubbard settle in California in 1967 and was employed by Pan Am Airways as a pilot. In 1974 Hubbard moved to Tulsa OK from San Jose, CA to join the Tulsa Air National Guard, 138<sup>th</sup> Tac Ftr Grp. In the Guard, he checked out again in their "new" airplane, the F-100, and then 3 years later, checked out the A-7D Corsair. He also was a flight and instrument instructor in the A-7D and remained in the Tulsa unit (125<sup>th</sup> Tac Ftr Sqn) until he retired from the Guard in July 1985, with 28 years total service in the USAF as a Lt. Colonel.

Daryl made many friends while in the Tulsa Air National Guard, and in 2004 was elected President of the Tulsa Air National Guard Retirees Association (TANGRA). It was a VERY BUSY 2-year term, which just expired at the end of December 2006. He remains on the Board of Directors.

Delta Air Lines acquired Pan Am in 1991 and he continued with Delta until his retirement in May 2002. Hubbard's commercial flying encompassed approximately 23,000 hours in 35 years, as a pilot and flight engineer. He flew all over the world in Boeing 707, Boeing 727, Lockheed L-1011, Airbus A-300 and Airbus A-310.

Faith Martha Blunt of Mesa, AZ, was Daryl's wife of 34 years. They met when he was going through F-100 school at Williams AFB, AZ in 1960. Three and a half years later, when Faith graduated from Arizona State Univ., they were married in Mesa. Faith received her degree in History with a teaching certificate and later after moving to Tulsa she graduated from TU Law school and passed the bar the same year around 1985. She was politically involved in the 1988 election and was State Director for presidential candidate Pat Robertson. Their sons are Bret and Bryan.

Faith discovered she had ovarian cancer in 1993, and after nearly four years of fighting it, she lost her battle in 1997. She was 56 years old. Almost three years later, Daryl met and married a First United Methodist associate minister, Connie Ichord on August 28, 1999. Connie was widowed in 1991. Connie has 2 daughters, Gretchen and Stephanie. Daryl and his wife Connie also have nine grandchildren. He keeps his Cessna 182 hangared at Jones Riverside Airport in Tulsa.

Daryl's memories of OSU and SAE are:

"During college, I pledged SAE and made many friends. I found pledging a bit onerous. At that time that there was a load on the pledge to make grades as well as spend time in the house and do specific chores (I lived in Stillwater, so I was able to go home at night). Initiation week was emotional as I recall. We (all the pledges) were made to think that we were all going to be held over as a pledge for another semester.... At the last minute and staring into extremely bright lights, we were all notified that we had all made it!"

*Daryl Hubbard Bio Continued:*

“I had several friends that I ran with. My best friend there was Frank Nelson, whom I remain in contact with to this day. Frank lives with his wife in Amarillo. I don’t think I ever heard Frank raise his voice in anger. He was my Pledge Father... (not sure about the term). Later on, he and his wife asked me to be their firstborn’s Godfather. Other friends were Ron Gibson, Bill Story, Bob Curnutt, Bob Rader, Gerry Mayfield, Keith Olmstead, Keith Rinker, and Jim Marshall. Frank Nelson was my best friend at the SAE house however. After I was initiated, I brought several Stillwater boys into the chapter. I was the first local that SAE pledged and initiated for a few years. A few of the ones that I brought to SAE were C.A. Collins and David Winslow, both local men.

“I have some good memories there. My most admired person was our housemother, Katherine C. Woods. She was a lady through and through. I remember that at the beginning of every year, she would give a lecture to the men of SAE about courtesy. She talked about, “How to treat people in general and how to be a gentleman”; also, how to dine correctly at dinner. Believe it or not, this is something not a lot of us got at home. I don’t think I did, so I was pleasantly surprised when she outlined the steps to dine in a gentlemanly manner. As a pledge, we were required to take Mom Woods to dinner on Sunday. I credit her with the manners I have to this day. She was an energetic, pleasant and delightful lady. On balance, the SAE’s were gentlemen.”

“ ‘Mom Woods’, as she was known, had a fantastic memory. She remembered meeting my mother years later and remembering that she (my Mom) had lost her husband (my Dad) at a very young age. My Dad passed away at age 35. Mom Woods always asked me, even years later after she had retired, how my mother was doing and that she knew that it was difficult to be widowed at an early age with four children (me and my 3 siblings). I always respected her for taking such an interest in me and what I was doing and my family. She was one of the finest ladies I believe I have ever known. I truly enjoyed visiting her in her little house just south of the SAE house at 1308 W. 3<sup>rd</sup> St. after she retired. She was happy in her house and I believe the men of SAE took good care of her and paid attention to her. She would always offer to make me a cup of coffee or hot tea when I came by to visit. Years later, when Mom Woods passed away, the funeral service was held at the First United Methodist Church in Stillwater. There were a number of SAE’s present at the service. Toward the end of the service we all sang several songs in remembrance on ‘Mom Wood’. ‘FRIENDS’ was one of the songs I remembered singing. We filled the sanctuary with those great words.”

“I enjoyed all of the extracurricular activities our group did. I participated in intramural softball every year. I also loved singing. We had a very good choral group. I remember one year we had a school-wide competition. We worked so hard on our songs. The songs we picked were “Awimoweh” and “Battle Hymn of the Republic”... Unfortunately, we did not win first, but we did come in second. We were very good. I also remember that once a week we would all go out as a chapter and serenade the pin / mates of our members at the Sorority houses. I believe over the years that I had a very positive experience with the OK Mu SAE’s.”

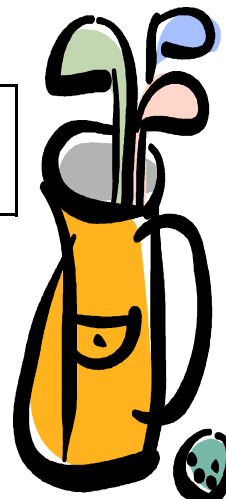

Steve Baker '65 named Commercial Realtor of the Year - Article recently ran in the Tulsa World: The Greater Tulsa Association of Realtors has named Steve Baker of CB/Richard Ellis Oklahoma as its 2006 Commercial Realtor of the Year. Baker is a frequent volunteer with GTAR, the Oklahoma Association of Realtors and the community. He serves on the GRAT board of directors and is president-elect for 2007. At OAR, he served on the board of directors as vice president representing the commercial sector in District VI.



Sherman Smith '42 recently donated \$20 million to Oklahoma State Athletics. The proposed \$50 million multi-purpose indoor facility will be the size of a soccer field and have a 90 foot high clearance. Many sports, including football, baseball, softball and track, will use the facility. This article ran in several prestigious publications including the Daily Oklahoman and The Journal Record. Sherman Smith's gift is the second-largest gift in Oklahoma State history.
